## 4. Practices

Data collected by the International Ice Hockey Federation indicates that students of ice hockey at all levels gain more from a practice format which emphasizes 1. small area games; 2. skill stations; and 3. frequent skating and puck-handling activity in smaller groups. Our own National Coaching Coordinator, Jeff Bonazzo, also recommends this approach. Internationally players will practice two or three times a week.
