Remit - Dunedin

That the Southern League add an additional age group known as 'Bantam ' and support a remit to NZIHF to add a Bantam national championship. The resulting age groups for children would then become :

U13 Pee Wee

- U15 Bantam
- U17 Midget
- U19 Junior

The advantages to the change would be :

- 1) to reduce the age discrepancy at which children are presently facing. For example, kids who have not yet turned 13 (in the calendar) could be playing against others who are almost turning 16.
- to reduce the age discrepancy at which children are first introduced to contact hockey. So Bantam would be the 1st year of checking and only a two year age gap would exist.
- 3) to enable the bigger, stronger clubs (Dunedin, Queenstown) to have more players playing at a ' Rep ' level.
- 4) to enable the smaller clubs (Gore, Alex) the flexibility to enter a combined teams (eg. Bantam & Junior) without having their children playing up against children too much older.
- 5) To continue to encourage the present practice of stronger kids playing up a category for additional playing time, but without them facing hugely older opposition. i.e. Tyler Hasslemore could play Pee Wee and Bantam, instead of Pee Wee and Midget.
- 6) To increase the number of children playing in the NZ Nationals which is a very positive & learning experience
- 7) To reduce the occurrence of promising 1st year Midgets missing out on the Nationals because of the 3 year age gap and number of kids playing Midget.
